

# **Cross and Crown Block Challenge**



### Welcome to the Workshop Committee's Block Challenge for 2024-2025.

The finished blocks made will be made into a Quilt and donated to our "Favorite Service Club", so when you hand in your block or blocks, please attach your nomination for your favorite Service Club. Go to the member only page on the VSSQ website for a pattern for this block.

Below is the criteria for the block challenge:

- 1. The finished block must be 9"x9".
- 2. The background must be white. This means plain, or tone on tone whites, no other colours.

3. The pattern colours must be medium tones - no bright reds, pinks etc. See the colors in the photo at left and pick colours in similar tones.

4. The center of the block must be made of red fabric.

5. Your block or blocks need to be handed in by April 30th so we can get them together before the end of our quilt year, i.e. middle of June.

6. You can make as many blocks as you want. All blocks are welcome.

The Vernon Silver Star Quilters Autumn Sale was a success once again this year. Thank you to those that came to visit the sale, enjoy the quilts and purchase handcrafted items. As a result of sales and donations at the door, our organization combined the proceeds from 2024 and 2023 sales for a total of \$750 in donations to three community groups – Cops For Kids, Salvation Army Kettle Campaign, and BGC-O (Boys and Girls Club – Okanagan) Each group received a cheque for \$250.

In addition to the monetary donations to our community, VSSQ gifts approximately 130 quilts each year to community groups. These gifts are distributed through organizations including Vernon Jubliee Hospital, Vernon Friendship Center (prenatal program), Vernon Health Unit, NOYFS, Seniors Complex Care homes, North Okanagan Hospice and occasionally to schools and church Christmas hampers.

Our next event is our Quilt Show – Quilters' Are Piecemakers – to be held at Vernon Recreation Centre Sept 26 & 27, 2025. Not only will there be over 200 quilts to view but a gift shop, tea room and



merchant mall. Mark your calendar now and look for more details as the date approaches.


