Quilt Show Challenge! - Linda Ensing

Quilters are Piece Makers - 2025 VSSQ Quilt Show - Guild Member Challenge Information

Welcome to the quilt show guild challenge! Every guild member is warmly invited to participate.

Here are the challenge details:

- 1. Small is beautiful. Your quilt must be 12" by 12".
- 2. Your quilt must include something silver. This may be silver fabric, thread, embellishments; feel free to use your creativity and imagination.
- 3. Keep in mind this year's theme of "Quilters are Piece Makers" (peace?) as you create.

Dates to be aware of:

- 1. By June 5, 2025, a registration form with plan/photograph needs to be submitted
- 2. Your quilt must be handed in by September 4, 2025
- 3. September 18th, the challenge submissions will be hung at the guild meeting; guild members have opportunity to view and then choose a favourite (another challenge!)
- 4. Your quilt will be hung at the VSSQ quilt show September 27-28, 2025

Other details including much freedom and some restrictions:

- 1. Any number of fabrics may be used.
- 2. Your quilt may be traditional or modern or anywhere in between or a combination! It may be machine or hand pieced, machine or hand quilted and applique is welcome. You may include embellishments.
- 3. If a published pattern is used, credit must be provided.
- 4. This piece (of course!) must be completely finished: quilting, binding, label, hanging sleeve.
- 5. The label should include:
- a. Title of the piece
- b. Artist's name
- c. Date completed
- d. Credits (give credit to sources and obtain written permission if using another person's design)
- 6. The hanging sleeve needs to be fully stitched to the back of the quilt.

We hope many of you may consider participating in this show's challenge. If you are looking for more information or have questions, please feel free to contact Linda Ensing.

Help Wanted – Quilt Show Committee/Gift Shop

Do you want something mindless to do as a break from the seam matching project you are currently doing? The guild typically puts any purchase made at the quilt show gift shop into a fabric bag. This is where we can all pitch in. Have ugly fabric or like to scour the scrap table? Bags can be any size (about the size of a grocery bag is most useful but smaller or larger is okay too) and only need to be well sewn on three sides! We will collect these bags in September of 2025. Quilt Show News — Susan Wilson

The quilt show challenge has been issued and details can be found elsewhere in the newsletter. The quilt show committee met in November and made several decisions including the concept for the poster and challenge – Quilters Are Piecemakers – and have meetings scheduled monthly starting in the new year. We will be looking to fill Lead Roles in a few areas in January.

Just a reminder that for every quilt you plan to submit to the non juried show you will need a full colour photograph of it attached to your registration form. So if the quilt is shown at guild, be sure to get a copy of the photo from our photographer. Alternatively, you can take your own photo and print it out in colour on your home printer. In addition, each quilt needs a sewn hanging sleeve at least 4 inches wide, made of good quality fabric, and sewn fully to hold up the weight of the quilt for the duration of the show. If you are planning on entering a quilt in the show, you can get a head start on this aspect of the process by sewing on the sleeve at the same time as the binding or if it is already bound, doing one this winter. If you have any questions about this or other questions regarding the quilt show, please don't hesitate to contact Susan Wilson.

The Colour Wheel is This Year's Theme December - Tint (with white added) of yellow, red, or blue

January - Mix Yellow & Red = Orange February - Mix Yellow & Blue = Green March - Mix Red & Blue = Purple April - Neutral Colour

May - Favourite Colour

FQ draw is held on the 2nd meeting of each month starting in October and ending in May. Fat Quarters should measure 20" x 22" and consist of good quality quilting cotton. Each FQ you bring entitles you to one entry to win the lot!

Autumn Sale Recap — Anita Reimer and Susan Wilson

The 2024 sale is in the books with the paperwork all done - and it is a fairly large task! With many people popping in to shop, there were a total of 133 sales of items priced from \$3.00 to \$800 offered by 20 guild members. That means just over 25% of items on display were sold.

Success was had in sharing our quilts and quilted goods with the larger community. Many people stop in to look as if it is a quilt show – which of course, it is on a much smaller scale. And as the concept was originally explained, one of the purposes of the sale is to keep our guild visible in the community every year rather than just in the quilt show years. In addition, it was never meant to be a money maker for the guild and so any profits were to be donated back to community organizations which do not receive charitable quilts from us. In the past we have donated to Santa's Anonymous, Hospice and hmm, I can't recall! This year when we combine the funds carried forward from last year's sale there will be three cheques for \$250 presented to Cops For Kids, Salvation Army Kettle Campaign and BGC (Boys and Girls Club). Thank you to the vendors who stepped up, offered goods for sale and helped through out the set up, sale itself and take down. Without you, this annual sale wouldn't happen. As a reminder, next year the gift shop will be held within the Quilt Show, so get sewing now!


