2025 Quilt Show Challenge – Please bring your completed quilt to the Sept 18 guild meeting for members to vote on. Anne Drover will collect them, hang them and the membership will vote for their favourite. You will then collect your quilt at the end of the meeting to prepare it for drop off on Sept 25. (NO pillowcase is required for this, unless you want to look after the case.) Please note that all challenge quilts will be hung at the guilt show, not just the winner, as previously indicated.

Sheets – wanted for the guilt show. Bring to Sept 18 meeting or drop off with your quilts. These are sheets that will be donated to 'charity' for their use after the show. (Not the community care quilts but outside charities.)

Bags for Gift Shop – bring in when you drop off your quilts Sept 25 and pass to Gift Shop area

Volunteers Thanks to those that answered the call for volunteer sign up. We still need help in the Merchant Mall, Bed Turning, Quilt Hangers, and Hostess/Security. (Note - If we do not get more members to sign up for this last area, we may have to consider closing for Friday – or not having people circulating to ensure your quilts are not handled by several hundred hands.) This was an area of concerned raised by several members and it is an important role. You get to chat with visitors, show the back if asked, give directions or sit at an exit. Please consider signing up for all vacancies at the first meeting in September – we will have our own table ready before the meeting to allow you more time to socialize after a summer away during coffee. This is our quilt show and we all should do our part.

Fat Quarter Draw—Debbie Briggeman


