Quilters Are Piece Makers quilt show 2025 is now in a virtual photo album, thanks to Louise for her tenacity in getting all the quilts captured. That number includes the Bed Turning Quilts, QuArtz Room, and Guild Challenge. Twenty-two quilts were offered for sale and one sold. The Gift Shop had 850 items for sale and 238 sold for an average price of about \$20. We had fewer visitors this time around (in particular on Saturday). Four quilts were recognized by guild and viewers and awarded ribbons on Oct 23. Congratulations to Debbie Briggeman, her Piney Hosta earned CQA rosette as viewer's choice. Endy Turner, Bev Keith and Shirley Weishuhn received ribbons from the guild. The merchants were thrilled with not only the show, but their sales as well and appreciate the way visitors had to exit through their eye candy! The show was able to ink the balance sheet in the black and for that we can all be thankful (in particular due to the slow Saturday.)

The comments that were received from merchants, guild members and the public have been collated and included in the master binder for the quilt show. Thank you all for helping make this, my fourth and final quilt show (as chair) a success.


