Festive chocolate chip cookies—with a kick!

As tasted at the Make and Take, this recipe adds a bit of colour to the everyday chocolate chip cookie and a kick of flavour as well. The 'kick' can be adjusted to taste but it pairs well with the chocolate chips I use – Chipits 70 % Dark Chocolate Chunks!

Cream until fluffy: 1 cup butter, 1 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup white sugar, 2 tsp vanilla. Beat in one at a time: 2 eggs.

Combine and the stir into wet mixture: 2 1/4 cups flour, 1 tsp baking soda, 1/2 tsp cayenne

Stir in:

2 cup chocolate chips (see note above), 4-5 diced seeded jalapeño peppers

Drop by teaspoon onto parchment lined cookie sheet.

Bake at 375° for 10 to 12 minutes

Set out for guests and watch their faces light up with joy!
