

For any new members, a "Fidget" is a small hand-held mini quilt or pillow, with various textures to be used for its calming effect. They are usually no bigger than 20"x20", and can include cotton, flannel, minky, zippers, Velcro, ribbons, or other embellishments. **HOW-EVER**, because these are intended for **Dementia Patients**, the hospital has requested that we **do not** include **Beads nor Buttons** as the patients mistake them for candy and try to eat them causing a potential frustration/choking issue.

Your fidgets can be brought to any VSSQ meeting and given to Deborah Coffey or myself, and we will make sure that they are given to the hospital.

The Colour Wheel is This Year's Theme

October - 3 primary colours—pure yellow, red or blue

November - Shade (with black added) of yellow, red or blue

December - Tint (with white added) of yellow, red, or blue

January - Mix Yellow & Red = Orange

February - Mix Yellow & Blue = Green

March - Mix Red & Blue = Purple

April - Neutral Colour

May - Favourite Colour

FQ draw is held on the 2nd meeting of each month starting in October and ending in May. Fat Quarters should measure 20" x 22" and consist of good quality quilting cotton.

Each FQ you bring entitles you to one entry to win the lot!
